## Transfer Station – Residential and Hauler Traffic Flow

## Please note:

- Residents and Haulers enter through the same entry point
- Residents and Haulers dispose of household waste in different areas
- Residents and Haulers dispose of recyclables in the same area
- Residents drive over the scale, but are not weighed
- Haulers drive over the scale and stop to be weighed
- Haulers are weighed three times: at entry, after dropping off household waste and then again after dropping off recyclables.
  Watch for haulers entering from the left at the entry point and when exiting the scale area.

Enter here to the right.

Do not attempt to drive beyond the barrier. That portion of the road is one way.

Haulers are required to reenter to be reweighed on the scale.



Continue to the weigh scale.

Keep a distance between your vehicle and the vehicle or hauler truck ahead of you.

If there is a hauler on the scale, do not drive onto the scale, as haulers are weighed using the scale

Expect them to remain on the scale for 30 to 60 seconds.



Drive over the scale and stop at the stop sign.

Follow any instructions from the attendant



Wait at the stop sign until you are instructed to move forward.

If you have a question, roll down your window and shout to the attendant.

The attendant will not come closer than six feet.



Travel to the left across the road to the disposal area. Watch for hauler trucks coming down hill from the right.

The first container is for solid waste. The last is for recycling. Note that haulers will be in the recycling area as well.

Follow the signs



## While at the Transfer Station:

- Practice social distancing. Leave 6 feet between you and others
- Wait your turn to dispose
- Follow the instructions of the attendants
- Attendants are instructed to keep 6 feet of distance between themselves and visitors to the Transfer Station
- Do not ask the attendants to dispose of or help carry your bags
- Failure to follow the instructions of the attendant or abusive behavior may result in loss of the use of the facility
