Mr. Brennan called the meeting to order at 7:30 p.m.

A. Consent Agenda

Upon motion by Mr. Clark, the consent agenda was approved as follows:

Minutes

• Board of Selectmen Regular Meeting Minutes of 6/03/13

Gifts

- \$501 to Wilton Parks & Recreation from Georgetown Lions Club
- \$50 for maintenance of Schenck's Island, in memory of Kathryn Schenck, from Robert and Carol Russell
- \$60 to Wilton Social Services from CL&P

Mr. Brennan expressed appreciation for these generous gifts.

B. Discussion and/or Action

1. Capital Projects and Plans

Middlebrook/High School Toilet Renovations – value engineering is being performed. Miller Driscoll Renovations – There were 20 responses to the RFP and a walk through was held today for architects. Comstock Community Center Renovations – The Building Committee elected Judy Zucker as Chairman and Bill Brautigam as Vice Chair. This group will also oversee the roof replacement at Comstock. Yankee Gas expansion – the Governor's Energy Bill passed

including a provision that extends payback from 15 years to 25 years. The Yankee Gas proposal has now gone to PURA, which has 120 days to respond. A project meeting with Yankee Gas is being arranged for next week. While waiting for the PURA response, we will be working on the agreement and asking Yankee Gas to submit a proposal.

2. Financial Report

Ms. Dennies distributed copies of the financial report (attached) as of 6/12/13. Revenues are doing well but there may be shortfalls in expenses. She is concerned about ending the year in the black and advised that she may be coming back to the Board of Selectmen to ask for funds from Charter Authority to cover any shortfall.

3. Middlebrook School and Comstock Community Roofs Project

Mr. Brennan distributed a summary of the \$162,436 shortage of funds for the Middlebrook School and Comstock Community Center Roof Replacements (attached). Ms. Dennies has identified two operating capital accounts where funds have been allocated, but remain unused, that could be considered for transfer to the roofing projects. The Charter only addresses the procedure for unused bonded capital, but Town Counsel has given an oral opinion that these funds can be transferred upon approval of both the Board of Selectmen and Board of Finance. Mr. Brennan moved to approve the use of \$162,436 of unused operating capital funding to cover the shortfall in two roof projects, after receiving the written opinion of Town Counsel. Motion seconded and unanimously carried.

4. Appointment to Comstock Building Committee

Mr. Brennan moved to appoint Joseph Seaman and Joseph Polito as members of the Comstock Community Center Building Committee. Motion seconded and unanimously carried.

5. Re-appointment to Area 9 Cable Council

Mr. Clark moved to re-appoint Gary Battaglia as Wilton representative to the Area 9 Cable Council for a two year term. Motion seconded and unanimously carried.

6. Miscellaneous Other Business

Ms. Dennies just received a final negotiated contract addendum from New World Systems to allow Wilton to obtain 37 additional days of implementation and training for the Community Development and Human Resources portions of the integrated technology program we purchased last December. Funding, in the amount of \$29,600, to facilitate this request is available in the fiscal year ending 6/30/13 budget. She was able to negotiate an hourly rate of \$100, which represents a 28.5% savings over the original contract amount of \$140 per hour. Mr. Saxe moved to authorize the First Selectman to sign the Additional Services Addendum with New World Systems, dated 6/14/13. Motion seconded and unanimously carried.

C. Public Comment - None noted

D. Reports

1. <u>First Selectman's Report</u> – Mr. Brennan would like to look into a possible Litter Ordinance with penalties. He will come back to the Board with more information about what other towns have ordinances and what the State Statutes allow.

2. Selectmen Reports:

Mr. Dubow - No report

Mr. Clark – Has spoken with residents on Wolfpit Road who would like to put flagstones along the steeper sections of the road to facilitate walking. Mr. Brennan advised that the Director of Public Works has some issues with putting paving stones along that road. He suggests that the neighbors look for a way to periodically cut the grass along the walking route. This will be discussed at a future meeting. Mr. Clark will be arranging for the Board of Selectmen to tour Ambler Farm, possibly at 7 pm preceding the next BOS meeting on July 1.

Mr. Hoffstatter – The Chamber of Commerce and Go Green are discussing possible ways to work with local businesses regarding things that would be beneficial to the environment.

Mr. Saxe – apologized for being late to this meeting but he was attending A Taste of Wilton, which was very well attended.

- E. <u>Executive Session</u> Mr. Brennan moved to enter executive session to discuss the Police Union Agreement and to invite Sarah Taffel to attend. Meeting entered executive session at 8:57 pm and returned to open session at 9:23 pm. Mr. Brennan moved approve the Police Union Agreement. Motion seconded and unanimously carried.

Re: Transfers Available to offset the Need for Charter Authority

It is my understanding that the Town needs approximately \$162,436 of funding necessary to address the roof projects at Comstock and Middlebrook School. I have identified two capital accounts where funds have been allocated but remain unused that should be considered to be transferred to the roofing projects to address the shortfall.

As you are aware, the Fire Department anticipated Regionalization in their Capital Projects budget. However, regionalization never came to fruition and does not appear to be happening in the near future. Therefore, capital project funds remaining in that Fire Department FY 12 Capital Budget total \$62,500 for other than MDT replacement. I believe your request to transfer those funds to the road program is advisable as they would otherwise be returned to the general fund at year end.

The second account that the Town allocated excess funds to was in the Assessors' Office for the 2012 revaluation. That capital account totaled \$234,000 but the competitive bidding resulted in significant savings. According to David Lisowski, Assessor, in order to compete work needed to address court cases, that capital project will be over funded by approximately \$100,000. Therefore, those funds will also be available for transfer.

According to the two projects above, \$162,500 is available for transfer to assist the roof project.
